As the reflection and sharing session in Satu Mare showed, our project achieved really wonderful results - our target groups were exploring new methods for learning and recognition in non-formal settings. Our achievements:



- **18 local workshops** implemented in schools, prison and other target groups;
- **Various methods** were piloted (Theater of the Oppressed, cooperation games, simulation and role-play games, Transactional analysis, Win-Win games and others)
- **Participants developed the following social skills:** teamwork and cooperation, expression, interaction between themselves, self-awareness, openness and less fear of show opinions and feelings, self-expression.
- Both **digital and paper badges** were issued to participants of the workshops recognising their achievements.
